YEAR 3

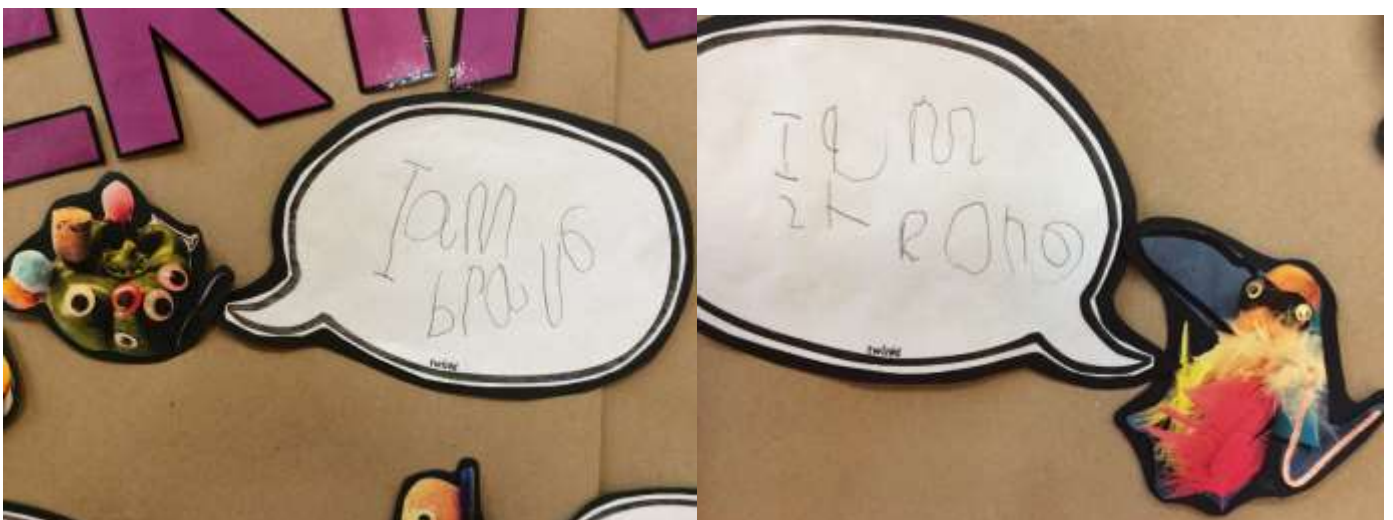

They made their own veggie superhero and thought about a superhero quality they would have. This is our first piece of written work. Well done Reception!



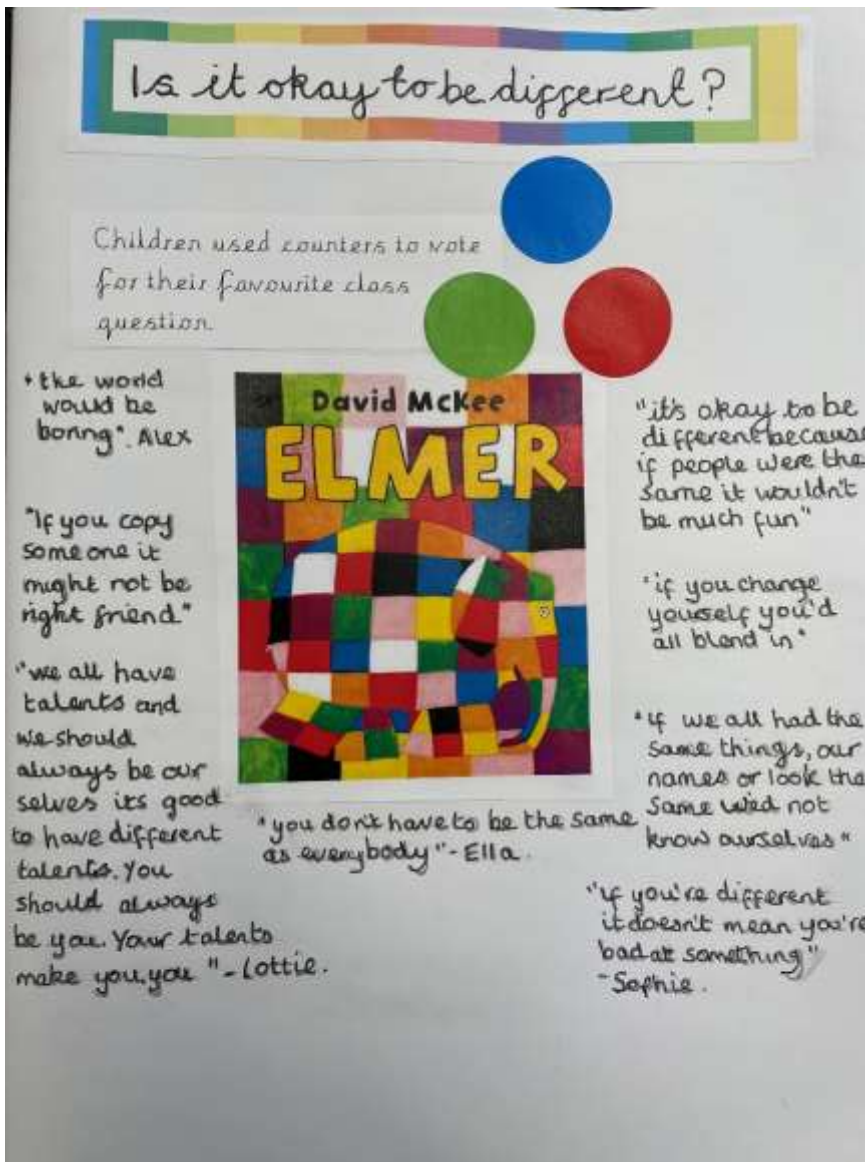


YEAR 4
