

World Book Day 2020



World Book Day 2020 takes place on <u>Thursday 5th March 2020</u>, and we would like to invite you to join us in making this a special occasion for the children in our school. <u>We are not dressing up on this day.</u>

World Book Day celebrates the joy and value of books, especially to children, and aims to help children start their own reading journey by giving them a £1 World Book Day Book Token. The token can be exchanged for one of the TEN special £1 World Book Day books or can be used to get a £1 discount off any book costing £2.99 or more.

All children should bring in their favourite books on this day. This is a good opportunity for children to recommend authors to their friends and inspire others to read some of the stories for themselves.

To help make the day memorable, we are asking all children to bring to school <u>a potato or two</u>! We will be holding <u>"Design a Potato Book Character"</u> competition. Children can bring a potato and any other materials they need together with their drawn design by Wednesday. They will be given time to turn their potatoes into their favourite book characters on Thursday. There are lots of different ideas online if you need some inspiration.



All the creations will be displayed in the hall at the end of the day.

We also going to carry on celebrating reading during our STEM Week, the focus will be on non-fiction books.

Please keep reading with your children, take them to the library, and help us to inspire a love of reading in your children.

The planned projects include improvements to the path up to the pavilion, to ensure better access for elderly members and non members, a disabled parking bay, tree planting, a woodland play area and a refurbishment of the cricket nets.

There will be regional and national TV coverage of the day, along with print media articles and possibly radio too. A professional England male and female cricketer will be in attendance and helping out with the projects.

The event is on Friday 27th March and we'd love to get 75+ people from a wide cross section of the Knutsford community down to our Booths Park ground on the day. Tatton Perk will be providing refreshments and there will be a free bacon sandwich and lunch available for all volunteers.

Egerton Lions Holiday Club


